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Dear fellow educator:

For forty years, the New Jersey State Board of Education has included a non-voting student member to represent the voice of New Jersey's students. The New Jersey Association of Student Councils (NJASC) has facilitated this student representation on the State Board. The State Board values the input of the students it serves. Therefore, student representation is especially important as the State Board considers such policy issues as high school graduation requirements, statewide testing and evaluating school districts. Given the direct impact that these and other issues have on students, the student voice on the State Board provides insight regarding the effects of educational policy.

Realizing New Jersey's diverse student population, the New Jersey State Board of Education and the New Jersey Association of Student Councils are extending an invitation to all high schools in Northern New Jersey to nominate a student to serve as the State Board student representative from July 1, 2027 to June 30, 2028. *Please note that your school does not have to be a member of NJASC in order for one of your students to be nominated as the student representative.*

Student representation on the State Board is selected on a rotating basis. Students from northern New Jersey are considered in odd years (such as 2027) and students from southern New Jersey are considered in even years (such as 2028). Therefore, students nominated from high schools in the following eleven NORTHERN counties will be considered for the office of State Board Student Representative: **Bergen, Hudson, Hunterdon, Essex, Middlesex, Morris, Passaic, Somerset, Sussex, Union, Warren**. Students from the ten Southern counties not listed above will have the opportunity to become a candidate for this position one year from now.

Students nominated for State Board student representative for 2027-2028 must be a high school sophomore or junior as of October 1, 2026, and be in good academic standing with no disciplinary record. **Each high school in the counties listed above may only nominate ONE student.** If your school intends to nominate a student for this position, we recommend that you identify your nominee as soon as possible in order to give him or her adequate time to prepare.

All potential nominees must attend the **NJASC Fall Business Meeting**, which will take place on Tuesday October 6, 2026 at The College of New Jersey in Ewing Township. More information about this meeting and links to online registration will be posted on our website at <https://njasc.org>. At this meeting there will be a special session "Running for State Office", which any potential nominee must attend with their advisor. Application forms to run for State Board Student Representative as well as all other NJASC State Offices will be distributed at this session. The completed application packet with all required letters of recommendation must be mailed to NJASC Executive Director Lou Miller postmarked by Friday November 13, 2026. Please note that incomplete or late application packets will NOT be considered!

Again, please note that your school does not have to be a current member of NJASC to nominate a candidate for this position. If a student from a non-member school is elected to the position, that school will receive a full complimentary NJASC membership from January 2027 to June 2028. We sincerely hope that during this complimentary membership period, the State Board student representative as well as other students from his

or her school will discover and take advantage of the many opportunities offered by NJASC at the state level to develop and foster student leadership in their school and community. Both the State Board and NJASC encourage all non-member schools to take advantage of this unique opportunity to get involved with their State Board of Education and become active in their state Student Council Association.

Please understand that the responsibilities of this prestigious position are quite extensive. If elected, the student representative and his/her faculty advisor must attend each monthly meeting of the State Board of Education. These meetings are typically the first Wednesday of each month at the New Jersey Department of Education building, located at 100 River View Plaza in Trenton. The state board members encourage active participation from the student representative at the monthly public meeting. Therefore, adequate time prior to each meeting must be devoted to reviewing policies and programs scheduled for action or review by the State Board of Education. Additionally, after each meeting, the student representative prepares a report for the NJASC Executive Board as well as the students of New Jersey.

In addition to the State Board's monthly public meetings, the State Board student representative will also serve as a State Officer on the 2027 NJASC Executive Board. Responsibilities include monthly Executive Meetings as well as taking a leadership role in the annual Fall (October), Winter (January), and Spring (May/June) NJASC State Conferences. As a member of the NJASC Executive Board, the State Board student representative will also participate in both sessions of the NJASC Leadership Training Conference (LTC) at The College of New Jersey in July 2027. It is expected that the school district will support the State Board student representative in all of these endeavors, with release time for the obligations specified above and financial support for the trip to the NASC National Conference.

Completed applications will be reviewed by the current NJASC Executive Board, with each candidate to be interviewed during the **December 2026 NJASC Executive Board Meeting**. All applications will be held in the strictest of confidence and reviewed based on the aforementioned criteria. If in the view of the NJASC Executive Board a candidate may not best fit the State Board student representative position but shows great potential to become a State Officer, he or she may be asked to become a candidate for a different position. If this happens and the candidate in question is from a non-member school, the school would be asked to join NJASC at that time. As stated above, non-member schools that have candidates slated for the State Board student representative position will not be required to join NJASC but will be given a complimentary full membership for the remainder of 2026-2027 and for the entire 2027-2028 school year if their candidate is elected.

All candidates slated for the position of student representative to the State Board of Education will give their campaign speech during the **2027 NJASC Winter Convention**, which will take place on Tuesday January 12, 2027, at The College of New Jersey. Student Council Presidents in attendance from throughout the state will then elect the student representative, as well as all other 2027 NJASC State Officers. The election results will be announced that afternoon and the successful candidate will work together with the current State Board Student Representative, Emilia Reynolds of Collingswood High School, to facilitate a smooth transition before becoming the official Student Representative on July 1, 2027.

We strongly encourage you to nominate a student for this important position. In order to be considered for this position, a nominee and his or her advisor must be available to participate in the entire selection process.
